	FAITH vs. <i>DISOBEDIENCE</i>	Having trust and reliance in God and demonstrating obedience to the Word of God.
	HOPE vs. <i>DISCOUR A GEMENT</i>	Having confidence that God is in control and will work all things out for my good and His glory.
	LOVE vs. <i>SELFISHNESS</i>	Giving to others needs without expecting anything in return.
	PATIENCE vs. <i>IRRITA BILITY</i>	Accepting and responding correctly to difficult situations from God as a normal part of the Christian life.
	HUMILITY vs. <i>PRIDE</i>	Realizing that any good in my life is the result of the common or special grace of God.
	RESPONSIBILITY vs. UNRELIABILITY	Knowing and doing what both God and others are expecting from me.
	FORGIVENESS vs. RESENTMENT	Responding to offenses from others as being allowed by God; and taking the Biblical steps to deal with these offenses.
	SELF-CONTROL vs. SELF-INDULGENCE	Instant obedience in doing what is right before God in the midst of specific and often difficult situations.

PEACE vs. ANXIETY	Structuring my life around that which is eternal and cannot be destroyed or taken away.
GENTLENESS vs. ANGER	Yielding my personal rights and expectations to God.
DETERMINATION vs. FAINT-HEARTED	Purposing to accomplish what God expects in His time regardless of the difficulty.
ENDURANCE vs. GIVING UP	The inward strength to withstand stress and keep going to accomplish God's best.
JOY vs. <i>SELF-PITY</i>	An inner radiance that results from being in genuine harmony with God and others.
KINDNESS vs. INDIFFERENCE	Investing whatever is necessary to heal the hurts of others.
GOODNESS vs. IMPURITY	The moral character that I demonstrate in my life in obedience to God's Word.
GENTLENESS vs. <i>HARSHNESS</i>	Expressing personal care appropriate to another's need.
DILIGENCE vs. SLOTHFULNESS	Visualizing each task as a special assignment from the Lord and using all my energies to accomplish it.
TOLERANCE vs. PREJUDICE	Acceptance of others where they are without demanding immediate change.
GRATEFULNESS vs. UNTHANKFULNESS	Making known to God and others what ways they have benefited my life.
FAIRNESS vs. PARTIALITY	Looking at a situation from the viewpoint of each person involved.
